
Bug Club

What happened in school this week?

Our Learning Project this half term asks the question,


"Is That Land Ahoy?"

Our learning in school this week.

In English we have recapped what a noun and an adjective is and then used this knowledge to create expanded noun phrases about Mr Hoppy eg. Mr Hoppy is **a shy, old man** who loved Mrs Silver.

In Maths we have been learning about multiples of 10. We then used our number bonds to make the next multiple of 10

E.g. $46 + ? = 50$ Then we used this knowledge to add a 2 digit number to a 1 digit eg. $48 + 7$ whereby we crossed over into the next ten. This allowed us to add in 2 jumps rather than 7 jumps e.g.



In topic we have been reading treasure maps and using positional language to move around the maps.

Activities for you to do at home

Please continue to practise counting in multiples of 2, 5 and 3 with your children at home and in tens from any given number; this is a key skill.

Reading books:

Your child will bring home a reading book appropriate to their reading level and one library book. The children visit the library once a week but have the opportunity to change their book earlier if they wish. We ask that you sign the reading record, when you read with your children at home.
