

HYNDBURN PARK PRIMARY SCHOOL
PUPIL PREMIUM

The Pupil Premium is funding in addition to the school's budget. Schools are free to decide how to allocate this funding to best support the raising of attainment for the most vulnerable pupils. If a child has been eligible for free school meals (FSM) at any point over the past six years or has been looked after for one day or more (Child Looked After) the school receives an amount of money per child.

In 2018 / 19 the Pupil Premium was used in a variety of ways to support children in school, including:

- The provision of additional teachers so that no class has more than thirty children in it.
- Providing targeted 1:1 and group interventions sessions to ensure that pupils eligible for the Pupil Premium reach (and in most cases exceed) their targets by the end of Y6.
- Additional teaching assistant support to deliver highly personalised intervention programmes.
- Employing a learning mentor to support vulnerable children and families.
- Employing a learning mentor to help to improve children's attendance.
- Employing a learning mentor to provide targeted support for vulnerable children and families.
- Providing four morning sessions of Easter School for all Y6 children.
- The provision of a wider range of extra-curricular activities for children to expand their cultural capital.
- Enabling more children to attend school residential visits and educational visits.

Examples of the impact in 2018 / 19 include:

- More children eligible for Pupil Premium in Y6 made expected progress in reading, which were above the progress figures for children not eligible for Pupil Premium.
- More children eligible for Pupil Premium attained higher than children not eligible for Pupil Premium in Y6 in reading, writing, and combined reading, writing and mathematics. A greater percentage also achieved the higher standard.
- The average progress of children eligible for Pupil Premium across the school (Y1 – Y6) was in line with the progress made by the children not eligible for Pupil Premium in reading, writing and mathematics.
- Attendance and / or punctuality improved for children eligible for Pupil Premium in reception, Y1, Y3 and Y5 in comparison to the children not eligible for Pupil Premium.
- Attendance improved across school during the academic year for pupils eligible for Pupil Premium in comparison to the previous year (previous year data in brackets): 2018-19 93.5% (92.7%).
- Punctuality improved across school during the academic year for pupils eligible for Pupil Premium in comparison to the previous year (previous year data in brackets): 2018-19 1.05% (1.72%).
- More extra-curricular clubs were on offer for children to participate in. Children eligible for Pupil Premium were provided with opportunities to attend lunchtime clubs, as well as after school clubs.
- No child missed out on an educational visit because of cost.

The school plans to continue with these strategies in 2019/2020 (*see Pupil Premium Strategy for further details*).
