 <p>Acorns – Year R</p>	<p>Our topic this term is 'Will you read me a story?' We will be focusing on fairy tales. We have explored many different tales this week. We will now move onto creating our own story maps and changing the end of a story.</p> <p>In maths we will be focusing on positions including under, over, next to. Don't forget our exciting class trip to the panto on Wednesday 11<sup>th</sup> December, please make sure you have made payment.</p>
 <p>Seedlings – Yr 1/2</p>	<p>Our literacy work will be looking at adjectives in more detail, as well as writing about our new topic.</p> <p>We will be looking at measurement in maths in a range of practical tasks.</p> <p>Our science topic for this term is about how we grow, including looking at healthy eating, our five senses and how people change as they get older.</p>
 <p>Saplings – Yr 3/4</p>	<p>In science we will be looking at food chains and learning the terms 'predator' and 'prey'.</p> <p>In literacy we are learning about speech marks (inverted commas) and will use them in a story based on our book, Varjak Paw.</p> <p>In maths we will be moving on to multiplication.</p> <p>We are beginning a new geography based topic called 'Misty Mountain Sierra' which will look at environments, mountains and the water cycle.</p>
 <p>Oaks – Yr 5/6</p>	<p>To look at biographies and autobiographies mostly focusing on the writing of Roald Dahl and Michael Morpurgo.</p> <p>In maths to recap on multiplication and division.</p> <p>In topic lesson to look at the 14<sup>th</sup> century, thinking about the quality of life they had and the nature of the 'Feudal System'!</p>
