Wider strategies	Review the current breakfast provision. Find additional funding to continue to give free breakfast to pupils. Employ a welfare officer to liaise with parents/carers.	Work closely with Magic Breakfast and P4YP

Employ a learning mentor to work with disadvantaged pupils	Permanent learning mentor employed who works with disadvantaged pupils on a timetable. She is available to pupils at break time & lunchtime.
