Our learning in school this week.

In phonics this week we have learnt the sounds v and w. We are working hard to blend all our sounds together to help us read.

In literacy we have continued to read the traditional tale 'The Little Red Hen'. We used a story map to help us retell the story. We also changed some of the characters and wrote our own versions of what they said.



In maths we have been learning about weight. We have been using the language of heavy, light, heavier and lighter, lightest and heaviest. We have also been using scales to work out which items are the heaviest!

In topic we tasted different breads from around the world linked to our story of The Little Red Hen. We also learnt about the different seasons and created wonderful autumn leaves collages.

We have also been learning all about the festival of Diwali and how this special event is celebrated.
