
Anti Bullying week commences 11th November in school.

Our learning in school this week.

In English we have been learning about Captain James Cook and his travels around the world. We have written captions whilst sequencing his life using key facts. We have been practising writing notes and summarising information.

In Maths we have been learning about number bonds of 100. We have used our knowledge of number bonds of 10 and 20 and used this to support our understanding.
