Where do we get your personal data from, what are we processing and why?

We collect your personal data survey questionnaires, or via event registrations or via our website. The personal data that we will collect may be your location and contact details.

By submitting your details to us you are consenting to us using your personal data for the purpose outlined. Our legal basis for this will be consent.

Provided you consent, we may also contact you about other Scotland's Moorland Forum initiatives and to invite you to relevant events. Our legal basis is consent.

At events, should you come along, we may take photographs and videos and use these to promote the Forum's work via our communication channels which include our website www.moorlandforum.org.uk, and our Twitter account @moorlandforum. Our legal basis for this is that it is in our legitimate interest to promote the Initiative by showcasing events.

Your Rights

- If we are relying on your consent, you can withdraw your consent at any time, at which point we shall stop processing your personal data in that way. Please note this does not affect the legality of our processing up to the date of your withdrawal of consent.
- You can seek to restrict our processing of your personal data, ask us to rectify any personal data we hold about you or object to us processing your personal data for the purposes stated above.
