Children In Need

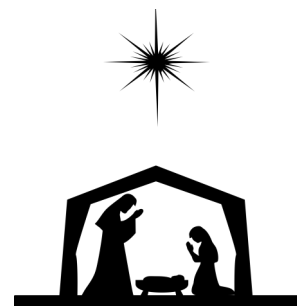
Well done to the school council. Their art competition raised £14.50 for Children in Need.
