NSPCC Parents meeting

As online safety is a concern for all of us, there will also be a parents meeting at 2:15pm in the hall. The meeting will last approx. an hour and will give lots of practical advice for how to keep your children safe when they are using their phones, tablets, etc.

The digital delay explained

We commissioned YouGov to survey 2,000 parents of 8 – 13 year olds to find out what they thought about keeping their kids safe online

91%

of eight year olds use the internet at least once a week

43%

of parents are prepared to wait until their children are at least 10 before they tackle the issue of online safety



Parents expressed concern about the emotional implications of talking to their kids about online safety before they're ten years old:

25%
of parents

believe that their children would find the conversation scary or upsetting

4 in 10
parents

felt a child of 10 would be too young to understand issues around online safety

10%
worryingly

admit they didn't see the need to talk to their children about online safety at all

The key to dealing with online issues is confidence

31%

of parents admitted they would refer their child to another adult or sibling if they were asked about an issue they'd had online

1 in 6

admitted they're more confident in giving 'real world' safety advice compared to online safety advice



Conversations work

We also surveyed 1,000 children and 60% of them changed their behaviour after speaking to their parents about online safety
