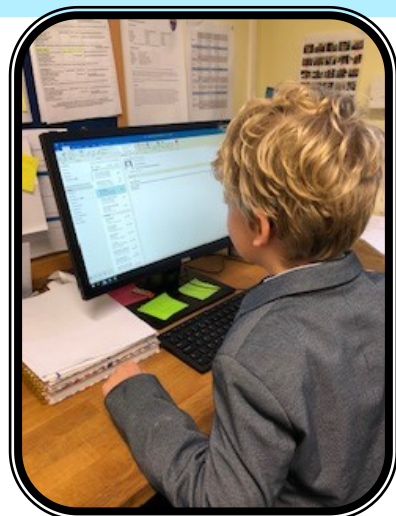


Special Edition Newsletter by Mr Marsh

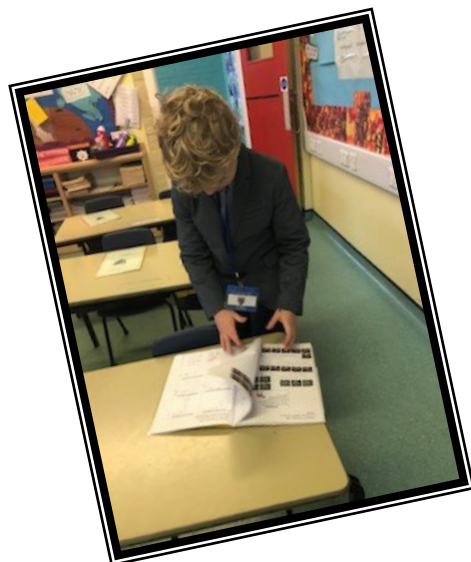
