In many ways it is a lovely, simple scene – the child Jesus and his devout parents, the wise old pair Simeon and Anna, and of course the pair of turtle doves.

Simeon and Anna capture the imagination. What a privilege, to witness the moment the son of God is presented back to God in the Temple; and what wisdom, to recognise the greatness of the moment. ‘My eyes have seen the salvation which you have prepared for all the nations to see,’ says Simeon, ready at last to die fulfilled. Meanwhile Anna, at 84 years of age, readies herself to spread the word about this child she has encountered.
