Nut Allergy

PLEASE We have been informed that a child in our school has been diagnosed with a nut allergy. We take the safety of all of our children very seriously and ask for your support in ensuring that you are not sending your child to school with items containing nuts that may cause a reaction. For example specific nut cereal bars, peanut butter, Nutella or other chocolate spreads on sandwiches / in dipper packs or chocolate bars with nuts in e.g. treat size snickers etc. We also ask you to bear in mind any treats that you send into school for your child's birthday e.g. Celebrations chocolates that contain mini Snickers etc. and remove these first. Items that state 'may contain nuts' or 'contains nut traces' are allowed. If you have any questions please contact school.
