## Parents Evening

Parent Evening meetings are next week, on Wednesday 4<sup>th</sup> and Thursday 5<sup>th</sup> March, from 3.10 – 6.30pm.

This meeting is an opportunity for your child's teacher to share their progress with you and discuss what they now need to focus on in their learning.

Booking forms will be released this evening, at staggered times, to allow you to book convenient slots to meet with your child's teacher.

These meetings take place in the School Hall where your child's books will be available for you to look at, either whilst you wait for your appointment, or after you have talked to the teacher.

Linked with our focus on Reading during World Book Day week, we have invited Usborne Books to join us to show a selection of books that will be available to purchase from them on the evenings. Please do browse their wide range of material during your visit. The sponsored read event, led by FoBIS last term, provided the school with over £2000 worth of their books to supplement our Reading Book selection so the children are already enjoying what they can offer in school!

### PLEASE REMEMBER:

Children should **NOT** be brought along to the parent meetings. Grover may be able to take booking for the Sunflower Group Slot between 3.00 and 4.00 if you need child care. Please contact them directly to arrange this. **Children are not able to join you in the hall for meetings and they cannot be left unattended in our Reception area.** Please make arrangements to support child care with your friends off-site to avoid congestion and safety issues in school during this busy time of parents coming and going. It is very difficult to turn parents away from these meetings when they have not made alternative arrangements however, we must do this to ensure the safety and smooth running of the evenings for all parents.
