World Book Day Fun

F1:

The children have been focusing on stories all week. They have created their own stories and used Active Stories in their PE session. On Thursday afternoon, Mrs Lee visited to read a story to all of the children. They have created displays in their rooms from the work they have done.

F2:

The children and staff thoroughly enjoyed a trip to the moon! We made jam or honey sandwiches this morning to take with us just like Baby bear did in our Talk for writing story 'Whatever Next'. We then put on our space hats and space boots, got in our rockets and took off into space until we landed on the moon. We listen to space music whilst we ate are sandwiches and then we read Whatever Next. Before we left the moon we watched a clip about astronauts. The children were busy drawing who they like to share their stories with, decorating their own book marks and drawing their favourite book covers. As a class, we wrote our own stories; we had a basket of characters for the children to choose from and various settings. We then used them to create a story that the adults have written and the children will help to illustrate.

Some of the stories we have shared are: Dustbin Dad, Brush your Teeth Please, The Cave, Shark in the Park, A Squash and a Squeeze, Stick Man, Poo at the Zoo, Room on a Broom, Wish Fish and The Tiger who came to Tea.

Year 1:

The classes shared the animal books the children brought in during the morning and children had the chance to swap and read their books to each other. They had a look at some animal poems, added actions for each animal and looked at the rhyming words/alliteration. They also made some book marks. The children then did some research on class animals, collected vocabulary and created some acrostic poems, with some children even using alliteration. In the afternoon, they created books/designed front covers, and teachers swapped classes to tell stories at the end of the day.

Year 2:

The children wrote reviews of their favourite books in EPIC. They completed graphs to show the genres of a range of authors in their Maths and replicated the work of illustrators in their Art afternoon. There was an interesting selection of books brought in by the children such as My Name is not Refugee, widening the children's exposure to different stories.

Theo created his own story called 'Miles Morales and Spiderman and the Venom's Evil Minions' using action figure stickers that he could narrate himself, without having to write it down! It was a very detailed story.
