**This week your child brought home their termly report. The table below explains what to find in the report.**

Attendance	This shows the percentage of time your child has attended school between the period 4th September and 6th March
Teacher's comment	This comment provides you with a general overview of your child in school. Specifically, their approach and attitude towards their learning as well as their social and emotional development.
Assessment table	Children are assessed on a scale for their year group. Through a range of evidence, these include class independent work, assessments and observations, teachers are then able to say if your child is working below standard for their age, at expected standard for their age or above standard for their age. <b>End of Year targets and progress</b> Children have end of year targets which are set primarily by their baseline assessments. Children in Key stage 2 (Year 3 to Year 6) use the data from their Key Stage 1 results. Children in Key Stage 1 (Year 1 and Year 2) use the data from their Reception assessments to set their targets. To make 'expected' progress your child would continue to be at the same standard each year. Teachers are then able to inform you with regards to whether your child is on track to meet their target.
Reading, writing and maths	Teachers will provide you with an overview on how your child is doing in these subjects.
Support	This section is completed during our parent consultation meetings – however due to current circumstances you can email the class teacher if you would like to discuss any support that you or the school could provide in addition to current provision.





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
