Dear Parents,

Welcome to this week's newsletter, I hope you are all staying safe and well.

I hope you all received a copy of your child's school report on Friday. If you did not please email me directly on [headteacher@bredhurst.kent.sch.uk](mailto:headteacher@bredhurst.kent.sch.uk) and I will ensure that it is sent to you. I did send it out a copy to every parent who completed the online submission form, which luckily was most of the school. For the parents who did not fill out the form I went through pupil files to find an email address – hopefully they were up to date! I also one report via the post! Fingers crossed everyone is now in receipt of these. If you do have any queries regarding your child's report please do contact your child's class teacher via their online form and they will get back to you.

As we are now on the Easter Break we will not be setting school work, although we have put links to several websites where the children can continue with their learning. The home learning page is regularly updated with information and links for the children. You have all also been sent a purple mash log in with your school report. The children can use this to access a variety of online learning opportunities, although we will not be setting any work through this platform. As a parent you can access the children's learning with your password.

Do remember to keep safe whilst online and if you have any concerns remember to report to CEOP or myself as Designated Safeguarding Lead. As a school we still have a duty of care to keep our children safe, in light of this we have added an amended Child Protection Policy to our website which relates directly to procedures in place during the Covid – 19 crisis.

The school mobile (07745782649) is kept in school so that whoever is in school can answer any queries. If you need to talk to someone please leave a voice mail or call this number. We are also happy to receive text messages but unfortunately cannot access picture messages. All the teachers continue to be available through their email via their class home learning page, myself and Mrs Place also have our email address on the home learning page.

The school will continue to be open during the school holidays for the children of key workers and vulnerable children as directed by the government. If your child needs to attend a session over the Easter break please email [headteacher@bredhurst.kent.sch.uk](mailto:headteacher@bredhurst.kent.sch.uk) as numbers of children need to be known in advance so that the provision and staffing can be planned. However, in line with the social distancing guidelines please may I remind you this is only if you really have no alternative provision for your child whilst you have to carry out your job in one of the key worker roles.

Currently we are being advised that schools will remain closed after the Easter break. As a school we will continue to run the same provision as we have been. The school will be open from 8.45 – 3.30 (breakfast club will continue to take place from 7.30 – 8.45) every week day from Thursday 16<sup>th</sup> April to children whose parents are key workers and have no alternative provision.

Please continue to send us your child's work and pictures, it really brightens up our days, we endeavor to add some to the school website. As all teachers are in school on a rota, they may not be updating their class pages on a daily basis, but will regularly add pictures and children's work as is viable.

We are all missing the children; it is a very strange time for everyone. All we can hope for is that our school community stays safe and looks out for one another.
