This Week

Simmons have been painting trees using branches and leaves they found on the school field.

Inkpen and Rosen have been out onto the school field again collecting branches and comparing their lengths. After that they used them to create woodland art work for the bears to enjoy.

Sharratt and Donaldson have been exploring the school's grounds looking for evergreen and deciduous trees. They are now going to be doing some writing about what they found.
