Car Parking

We have just been informed that the East Riding of Yorkshire Council is putting more services in the Children's Centre. This will result in a further 20 – 22 members of staff working out of the Children's Centre. This will of course mean an increase in the number of cars that will need to park either in the car park or on the streets outside the school.

Although the car park on the site is a shared car park between the Children's Centre and the School, we have no ability to stop this happening. The new members of staff will be arriving in the week after half term. During this week there will be many more cars on the site and a number of removal vans.

In order to ensure that everybody is as safe as can be on the site during that week we are going to stop all vehicular access to the site by parents. The pedestrian access will be by far the safest way to access the site and we would encourage all parents to use this access point and not to come down the drive on foot.

Further information about how we will managed ingress and egress around the site will be given when we are clear of the impact this will have around the site.

This will not affect Blue Badge holders in the short term but this may need to be reviewed in the future.

We apologise for any inconvenience this causes but our main priority is to keep adults and children safe on site.
