General advice on preventing the spread- steps people should take:

- Wash hands often, with soap and water for at least 20 seconds, particularly:
- Before leaving home
- After using the toilet
- After breaks and sporting activities
- Before preparing food
- Before eating any food, including snacks
- Before leaving school
- Avoid touching their eyes, nose and mouth with unwashed hands
- Cover their cough or sneeze with a tissue, then throw the tissue in a bin
- Avoid close contact with people who are unwell
- Clean and disinfect frequently touched objects and surfaces
