COVID 19 – PARTIAL RETURN TO SCHOOL

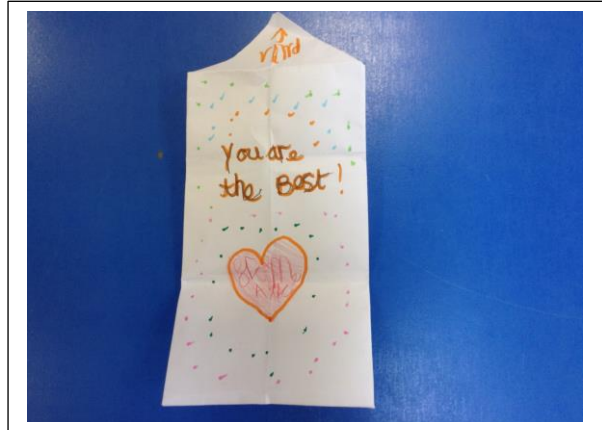
Reception, Year 1 and Year 6 parents should all have had a letter now if they want their child to return to school during June. Please see the risk assessments (RA) on the front page of the website. Everyone needs to adhere closely to the requirements laid out in the RA. Key worker parents have been pulling up into school and dropping children off – I would ask them to pull up closer to the pavement and be parallel to the kerb – we will have two slots for dropping off in the centre next week so the queue does not end up going down the street. If possible we would like to create a one way system for walkers so that you go along the far pavement and cross the road at the corner of Westfield junior school and walk along the front of the building and leave via the exit near the entrance to the church carpark. Year one parents will come right to the end of the carpark and pull out via the gate that is normally locked and Reception drive right up to the top of the side carpark. I hope that all this will become clear once routines are established. Uniform should be worn by all groups of pupils and if you run out – clothes as close to uniform as possible – no bright colours or patterns.

We have been busy preparing the classrooms ready for the return of Reception and Y1 children next week. Although the rooms look a little different to what we are used to, we will soon get used to our new routines so that we can continue learning whilst keeping everyone safe

Year 2- Joshua, Ivy, Yakub, Eamonn, and Charlotte

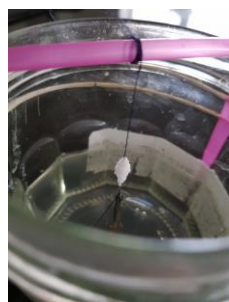
Year 1 – Hayden, Teegan, Lacey, Halle, and Lenny.
