PLEASE BE AWARE SCHOOL IS NOW FULL TO BURSTING – if we get anymore requests for key worker places we will have to start including year 5 key worker children in the year 6 bubbles or year 2 children in the year 1 bubbles. Any new applications for key worker provision will have to be strictly limited and investigated. Please only use it if you have no other options – sorry to sound so unwelcoming but you will see from the Risk Assessment that we can only accommodate 8 bubbles of 15 children. Those children that do not come back by Monday 15th (Years R, 1 and 6) may not be able to change their mind at a later date if we do have to put year group bubbles together with Key Worker children.

Parents Years 2 -5

I appreciate this is a difficult and frustrating time for parents and children who are still at home. Following the announcement from the Secretary of State for Education on Tuesday, I am writing to inform you that, under current guidance, Ss Peter and Paul school does not have the capacity to welcome back children from Years 2 to 5. I know this is disappointing. When we receive guidance regarding when and how schools will be reopened for all pupils, we will let you know. In the meantime, please make best use of the resources available online and join us for recorded stories and worship which I will be adding to the website.

Reception, Year 1 and Year 6

The partial opening of school to the above year groups is working well so far. Thank you all so much for your cooperation and praise for how the system is working so far. From Monday 15th, we will be adding Year 6. Parents should all have had a letter now if they want their child to return to school during June. Please see the risk assessments (RA) on the front page of the website. Everyone needs to adhere closely to the requirements laid out in the RA.

Key worker parents have been pulling up into school and dropping children off – I would ask them to pull up closer to the pavement and be parallel to the kerb – we will have two slots for dropping off in the centre next week so the queue does not end up going down the street. These cars should leave from the centre of the carpark as most of you have been doing. From Monday can you pull into the carpark via the second entry gap rather than the drop off lane as this will be for year 6 only.

Year one parents have been coming right to the end of the carpark and pulling out via the gate that is normally locked and **Reception** driving right up to the top of the side carpark. This routine has worked extremely well so far – so let's hope with the addition of the two year 6 bubbles we can maintain the calm that has been so evident this week. **Year 6** children will be picked up and dropped off in the drop off lane – they will then line up against the fence next to a demarcated spot. If possible, we would like to create a one way system for walkers. Please go along the far pavement and cross the road at the corner of Westfield junior school and walk along the front of the building and leave via the exit near the entrance to the church carpark I hope that all this will become clear once routines are established.

Uniform should be worn by all groups of pupils and if you run out, then clothes as close to uniform as possible – no bright colours or patterns.
