Dear Parents and Carers,

Please let me start by saying how disappointed we are that Year 6 will not be able to return. We have worked exceptionally hard balancing the key worker bubbles to try to make it work. However, on Wednesday it became apparent, due to a number of key worker applications received, that we would not be able to proceed with our plans for Year 6. I am sure the children were looking forward to returning to school, as much as the staff were. I am especially concerned because it again happened at such short notice, but I thank all the Year 6 parents and children for their understanding of the situation. Please note we are almost full to capacity for key worker bubbles and have no space to provide any more bubbles once we are full. Applications will take 5 working days to access any of the existing bubbles.

Key Worker Bubble A classroom 3 (9-3.40) using Class 3 door, drop off/pick up junior playground

Key Worker Bubble B classroom 4 (9-3.40) using junior entrance, drop off/pick up junior playground

Key Worker Bubble C in Classroom 6 (9-3.40) using Class 6 door, drop off/pick up from garden

EYFS children are in Class R and Class 1 (8.45-3.25 or 8.50-3.30) drop off/pick up infant playground

Y1 Bubble A children will be based in the class 2 (8.35 -3.15) drop off/pick up from the infant playground

Y1 Bubble B children be based in class 5 (8.40 - 3.20) using Class 5 door, drop off/pick up from garden

The timings for drop off and pick up are working very well, as is the one way system around the school. Could I please ask you though, not to come too early for drop off or pick up, as we are trying not to have any clusters of people waiting, or bottle necks of congestion around the school. It's also important that if you bring siblings to school (or you have already collected one and are waiting for another), you keep them close to you at all times, so that they are not playing/socialising with children from another bubble. Please also ensure you follow the social distance rules of staying 2 metres apart during drop off/pick up. We really do appreciate your cooperation with, so we can all continue to support each other in keeping safe.
