

Keeping smart online

Remember these 5 SMART safety tips when you are using the internet and mobile phones:

S

SAFE Staying safe involves being careful and not giving out your name, address, mobile phone number, school name or password to people online.

M

MEETING someone you have contacted online could be dangerous. Only do so with your parent's/carer's permission, and when they can be present.

A

ACCEPTING e-mails or opening files from people you don't really know or trust can get you into trouble - they may contain viruses or nasty messages.

R

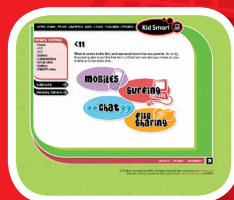
RELIABLE Anyone can put or say anything on the internet. Make sure you check it before you believe it.

T

TELL your parent or carer if someone or something makes you feel uncomfortable or worried.

TECH FEST

- This leaflet will help you to convince your parents and teachers that you know how to keep safe online.

- Chatrooms, IM and forums are great for meeting with old and new mates – but if you don't know who you're talking to in real life – you need to remember that they're a stranger and that they might not be who they say they are.
- Remember to be careful, always keep your personal information private, and never meet up with anyone you've met online.

- The internet is amazing. Not only can you play games, listen to music and chat, but you can find out almost anything you want to online.
- Share cool sites with your friends – but remember that not everything you read online is true.
- If you see anything you're not sure about, or that upsets you – talk to an adult straight away.



MOBILE MANIA

It's not only when you are in front of your computer that you need to remember to be SMART. You can get junk on your mobile too, here are some things to think about:

- If you start getting upsetting or annoying texts - don't reply to them and tell an adult you trust straight away; they can contact your network and ask for help.
- Think before you send. If you have a camera phone, remember that once you send a picture to another phone or to the net it could be there forever. Get your friends' permission before taking their picture.
- Always keep your PIN safe and your mobile out of sight on the street.
