Reports

The children's end of year reports will be available from Monday next week. The children currently attending school will bring their report home with them on Monday. For those children not attending school their report will be available to collect between Monday 13th July and Thursday 16th July from 9.00am-3.00pm. They will be in the front entrance of school in year groups with the child's name on. We will leave two copies for both parents/carers where this is necessary. If there is not an additional report available and you require one, please ring the bell at the main office and we will copy a report for you. All reports not collected by 3pm on Thursday 16th July will be kept in school until September. Within the report envelope there will be a letter explaining the report and a slip for your feedback. Enjoy reading your child's report, and please fill in the feedback slip. Feedback slips can be brought back to school by the children currently attending. For the children not currently attending there will be a box in the school entrance and they can be dropped in from Monday – Thursday between the hours of 9am – 3pm. We welcome all feedback in our continued drive to be the best we can be. Many thanks in advance for your cooperation in collecting your child's report.

Book Return

We are kindly asking that reading books that were sent home at the start of the school closure, are returned to school by the end of this term. This applies mainly to children in Year Reception, 1, 2, 3 and some of our Y5 children. The return of books will help staff to organise and sort books ready for September. It would be really helpful if books could be returned inside your child's Reading Record. For the children currently in school their Reading Record and books can be handed in to their teacher. For children not in school, we have left a box in the front entrance as of today. Reading Records and books can be left in the box Monday – Thursday between 9am – 3pm for the next two weeks. We thank you in advance for your cooperation.
