IMPORTANT DATES & TIMES for September 2020

As you know it is expected that all children will return to school in September however there will be some changes on how we would usually operate including start and end times for each class. This is so we can keep the children as separate class bubbles as much as possible until guidance changes again.

With this in mind we will be having 3 different start and end times and using 3 different entrances.

Term starts on **Monday 7th September for Year 1 to Year 6** and on **Monday 14th September for both Reception classes.**

Please note that for their first week Reception will finish at 12 midday so that the teachers can either meet with parents or have phone conferences with you about your child. This is to take the place of home visits due to the current circumstances.

You have been sending in your work by email over the last few months and we have loved seeing everything you have been doing. However, in September we would like to have a look at the real thing and your home learning books so please keep them safe over the summer break and bring them into school with you in your first week back. And don't worry if you didn't manage to do everything we would still love to see your work.

Parent & Carer Code of Conduct

Governors have ratified the updated Code of Conduct for Parents and Carers which outlines the school's expectation of behaviour to staff, children, other parents, governors and visitors to the school. The Code of Conduct can be found under policies on our school website.

School Streets

School Streets will begin in September and you will be receiving more information about this shortly. This does mean that in September you will not be allowed to drive down Worsley Road, Elsham Road and a small part of Cary Road between the hours of 8.30am and 9.30am and 3pm and 4pm. The only exception to this is if you live in these roads or you have a disability badge.

I believe if you live in these roads and already have a parking permit your car has automatically been registered for the scheme and you have been informed of this.

Please note if you have a parking permit for CH or CHE you still cannot drive down these roads at these times. It is only for school staff and the residents of Elsham, Worsley and part of Cary Roads.

Cameras will be monitoring the traffic and fines will be issued.

What will the school day look like in September?

There will be a number of things different at school when your child comes back in September. For example children no longer need to sit apart from each other in class however they will be at tables facing the front (apart from Reception) and the children will be in class 'bubbles.'

Parents unfortunately will not be allowed in the playground and will need to say goodbye at the school gates.

We will not be able to hold whole school assemblies or for the class bubbles to cross over and the children will play together in zoned parts of the playground. Playtimes and lunchtime will be staggered. Staff however can move between the children and bubbles.

Parent consultations will take place over the phone for the first half term and we are keen to speak to you all to see how you are.

Breakfast club can still go ahead however there will be no hot food and the children will be kept in bubbles according to their class. Children will be given cereal, a yogurt, a piece of fruit and a drink. You will need to re-register your child for breakfast either next week or the first week back.

I'm sure there will be other things that are different for us all as well and with guidance probably changing in August I will be able to give you more information in my Head Teacher newsletter in September. In the meantime though do keep an eye on our website which we will update over the summer as necessary.

The School Curriculum

We have recently updated the curriculum information on our website for you to read. We have amended our Personal, Social, Health Education, (PHSE), policy and practice to take into account the revised Relationship and Sex Education, (RSE), curriculum which becomes statutory in September. However we continue to teach PHSE through the 'Jigsaw' programme as we have been doing for a number of years and we will be holding parent meetings when we are allowed to go through the new RSE expectations.
