Dear parents / carers,

As we end what has possibly been the strangest school year ever, here is my last letter of the school year. Last week, you should have received your child's report (not for nursery children), hand-delivered by our staff. If you have a child starting in either nursery or reception next year, you should have also received a letter explaining when they will start and how to drop them off / pick them up. If you have any questions at all about either reports or nursery / reception starters, please ring school and someone will be able to help you.

This week, like last, we've had about 25 children in school, along with all of our staff. We've been working hard to prepare for the new school year, and planning how we will do things differently to keep both children and staff as safe as possible. At the end of the summer holidays, I will be posting letters on the website (www.hyndburnpark.lancs.sch.uk) about how things will be different in the autumn term. There will be different letters for different year groups, so please check the website before your children come back to school. If you have a child in Y1 – Y6 next year, they will all be **due back in school on Wednesday, September 2nd, 2020**. The government has announced that all children will be expected to be back in school (unless the situation changes) and fines will be issued to parents / carers who do not send their children back.

You will be receiving a text message from school, letting you know how to pay for things electronically from September. The School Money app will allow you to pay for sweatshirts, lunch money etc. online, reducing the need to use cash going forward, making it safer for you and for our office staff.

On the website today, there's a story for you to share with your children, if you wish to, about what school will be like in September. There will be quite a lot of changes, particularly around the start and end of the day, lunchtimes and break times. There will be more about this in the letters at the end of the summer holidays.

Finally, we say goodbye to Miss Feldwicke, Miss Dobie and Miss Ahmed today, along with all of our lovely Year 6 children. We send them all of our very good wishes for the future, and wish them all well.
