Dear Parents,

In the Spring term, before lockdown, the children, staff and governors reviewed our vision statement. It remained very similar and is copied below. Test and trace

This week, NHS telephone handlers have experienced an increase in calls to NHS 111 relating to testing. The current guidance around test and trace urges parents to call 119 or go online to book a test for anyone with symptoms. The LA have asked us to promote the use of 119 or the online service for testing thus leaving the more familiar 111 number when urgent immediate medical advice is required by families.

Social distancing

Social distancing is in place at the at the school gates. Now that the school is fully open, larger numbers of children and families will be coming to school entrances at the start and end of the school day. Even though schools are back, it is still necessary to make extra efforts to prevent COVID-19 being passed from person to

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person. Parents, carers and those taking and collecting children from school still need to be mindful about social distancing, especially when there is potential for groups to form, such as when arriving at school

Homework

Homework will be set from 21st September. We will set most of the homework online, including reading. More details to follow. In the meantime, please read with your child, at least 3 times a week.

Flu vaccination programme

The flu vaccination programme in schools will be going ahead in the autumn term, on 8th December at our school. You will get an email from the NHS soon and must consent to the vaccine by 30.9.20. It is likely that flu and COVID-19 will both be circulating at the same time which means that it is more important than ever this year to help protect against flu. Flu kills thousands of people every year. It is an unpredictable virus and the vaccine is the best protection we have against it. The main purpose of the school aged annual flu vaccination programme is to reduce transmission in the community. Children can pass flu on to others in their immediate family and wider community, many of whom may be at higher risk from the complications of flu. The flu vaccination won't protect against COVID-19 but it is critical to protecting the general health of the population, particularly those at high risk from COVID-19. All children whose parents agree for them to have the vaccine, which is given by way of a nasal spray, also benefit from the protection it provides to them as individuals. It helps to contribute to a healthy school environment, reduces school absences, and indirectly protects teachers as they are less likely to catch flu from their pupils.

If you have a child who was born between 1st September 2016 and 31st August 2017 you should apply for a school place soon. You should receive information from the local authority by 17th November 2020 and you will be able to apply for a school place until 15th January 2021.

If you have a child who will be starting school next September, or know anyone who has, and would like to know more about our school please get in touch. We would usually offer a visit, unfortunately the COVID restrictions means this will not be possible for now. Instead we have arranged Microsoft Teams meetings to show people around our wonderful school. Please contact the office if you are interested.

You will receive an information pack from the LA about applying for a place in Nottinghamshire schools. If you are applying for a place at Wood's Foundation School you should also collect an additional pack from our school office. Children are admitted to the school using the admission criteria. Usually, half of the children who are admitted come from Woodborough, have a sibling or attend church, the rest of the children who join us do not meet these criteria. So please be reassured you have a good chance of securing a place.
