Nursery Checklist – Please ensure that your child has the following items in nursery each day and that **all the items you send to Nursery have your child's name on them.**

1. A warm coat that can be used for outdoor play. (This may get muddy at times)
2. Spare Clothes, underwear and socks in their named bag on their coat peg. Please send additional items if your child has been changed in Nursery.
3. A pair of Wellington Boots or Snow boots.
4. A green reading book bag which can be bought from the school office.
5. Spare Nappies (if needed)
6. A packed lunch if your child is staying for dinner in a named lunch box / bag.

### Learning at home

This year we will continue to send home homework tasks for you and your child to complete alongside a weekly library book to read.

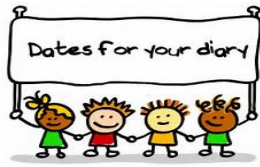
Due to the Coronavirus we have changed our library system. There will be two sets of books that children can use. One set will be returned books which will be kept in Nursery and not used for at least 72 hours. The other set will be a collection which have been wiped and not used since the previous week. Children will choose the book they are taking home from this set. Library books will be changed every FRIDAY from the 18<sup>th</sup> September.

Please can children bring their green book bags every day from tomorrow.

### Voluntary Termly Contributions

The children's Nursery Education is funded by the Government but this does not include money to provide the children with a **present at Christmas and Easter, some additional visitors to school, parties and treats.** To be able to fund this we have a school fund which we ask all parents to contribute to. We ask for a contribution of £10 per term, per child which will be collected this term from the 21<sup>st</sup> September through our Parent Pay system. I would like to thank you in advance for all of the contributions you make. Your Parent Pay details will be sent out in due course.

### Measles, chickenpox and shingles

Please may we ask for your co-operation in an important matter.

One of our pupils is receiving medical treatment for cancer which puts them at risk if they are exposed to measles, chickenpox or shingles.

Please let us know immediately if your child is suspected of having measles.

Our pupil is also at risk from chickenpox and would need to be given an injection within three days of contact. If your child is suspected of having chickenpox, you should let us know immediately.

It is also important that you let us know if there is shingles in your household.

Your child is not at any risk whatsoever from this situation. However, the health and well-being of our pupil who is at risk does depend on the co-operation of all other parents and we hope you can help us.
