
Anti-Bullying at Hill View

In school we talk a lot about 'Bucket filling' – a concept based on the book **Have you filled a bucket today?** By Carol McCloud. This helps children to understand the importance of kind behaviour and building self-esteem in both themselves and others. It also discusses the negative impact of unkind actions and words. There is lots of information and various activities online to support this, that you could discuss at home with your child.
