Advice for Child to Self-Isolate for 14 Days

Dear Parents and Carers of Year 2 pupils,

We have been advised by Public Health England that there has been a confirmed case of COVID-19 within the school.

We have been advised by the national Test and Trace programme and have identified that your child has been in close contact with the individual who has tested positive for COVID-19. We cannot provide further details of the individual who tested positive for privacy and data protection reasons, but rest assured, a full investigation has been conducted with Public Health England to identify close contacts.

In line with the national guidance we request that your child now stays at home and self-isolates until Friday 4th December 2020 (14 days after contact).

We are asking you to do this to reduce the further spread of COVID-19 to others in the community.

During this period of isolation, we will provide remote learning for all Year 2 pupils via our School's website. We will be setting up a Year 2 Remote Learning page, within the CURRICULUM tab of the website. This will be provided from Tuesday 24th November to Thursday 3rd December. We will be sending remote work out for Monday 23rd November, however this will take time to organise, so we are expecting this to be online by midday on Monday. Miss Edwards (Year 2 class teacher), will also be self-isolating, so she will make contact with you via email to support you with the remote learning. Phone conversations with Miss Edwards will not be possible during the self-isolation period. We will have a Year 2 email address set up for you to use by Tuesday 24th November – details will be sent to you via the School app on Monday 23rd November.

If your child is well at the end of the 14-day period of self-isolation, then they can return to usual activities, including returning to school.

Other members of your household can continue normal activities provided your child does not develop symptoms within the 14-day self-isolation period.

What to do if your child develops symptoms of COVID 19

If your child develops symptoms of COVID-19, they should remain at home for at least 10 days from the date when their symptoms appeared. Anyone with symptoms will be eligible for testing and this can be arranged via <https://www.nhs.uk/ask-for-a-coronavirus-test> or by calling 119 .

All other household members who remain well must stay at home and not leave the house for 14 days. This includes anyone in your 'Support Bubble'.

The 14-day period starts from the day when the first person in the house became ill.

Household members should not go to work, school/college or public areas and exercise should be taken within the home. If you require help with buying groceries, other shopping or picking up medication, or walking a dog, you should ask friends or family. Alternatively, you can order your shopping online and medication by phone or online.

Household members staying at home for 14 days will greatly reduce the overall amount of infection the household could pass on to others in the community.

If you are able can, move any vulnerable individuals (such as the elderly and those with underlying health conditions) out of your home, to stay with friends or family for the duration of the home isolation period

Symptoms of COVID 19

The most common symptoms of coronavirus (COVID-19) are recent onset of:

- new continuous cough and/or
- high temperature and/or
- a loss of, or change in, normal sense of taste or smell (anosmia)

For most people, coronavirus (COVID-19) will be a mild illness.

How to stop COVID-19 spreading

There are things you can do to help reduce the risk of you and anyone you live with getting ill with COVID-19

Do

- wash your hands with soap and water often – do this for at least 20 seconds
- use hand sanitiser gel if soap and water are not available
- wash your hands as soon as you get home
- cover your mouth and nose with a tissue or your sleeve (not your hands) when you cough or sneeze
- put used tissues in the bin immediately and wash your hands afterwards
