### LATEST COVID INFORMATION

Thank you for being vigilant and spotting coronavirus symptoms.

- a loss or change to your sense of smell or taste this means you've noticed you cannot smell or taste anything, or things smell or taste different to normal

# News from around the school....



Nursery have continued to look at the story of Goldilocks and the Three Bears. We have focused on cutting this week and have enjoyed lots of activities to help us with this, such as cutting spaghetti, wool, paper, Play Doh and straws. Keep practising this very important skill at home.

A big thank you to the parents that have put things up on tapestry, especially the children reading and sharing their new home school books. The children have loved seeing it in class and talking about it.

In Reception we have been looking at the story Pumpkin soup. We have made and used some great story maps to help us remember important features of the story such as characters and setting. We even made up actions to help us retell the story, see if the children can retell the story at home. In class, we made our very own soup , we all tasted it and we are pleased to report that it was yummy!

## **YEARS 1 / 2**

The children in KS1 have been designers and creators in their theme lessons this week. They have designed and made a sock puppet which they will use to produce puppet shows with their friends. The Wrens and Sparrows have started reading 'One Ted Falls out of Bed' by Julia Donaldson. Ask them to retell the story in their own words. In Maths, Hummingbirds have moved on to looking at multiplication focusing on the 2, 5 and 10 times tables.








## **YEARS 3 / 4**

Year 6 are exploring the natural disaster that happened in Pompeii when Mount Vesuvius erupted. Children are using their research and knowledge of the shocking event to write their own newspaper articles!
