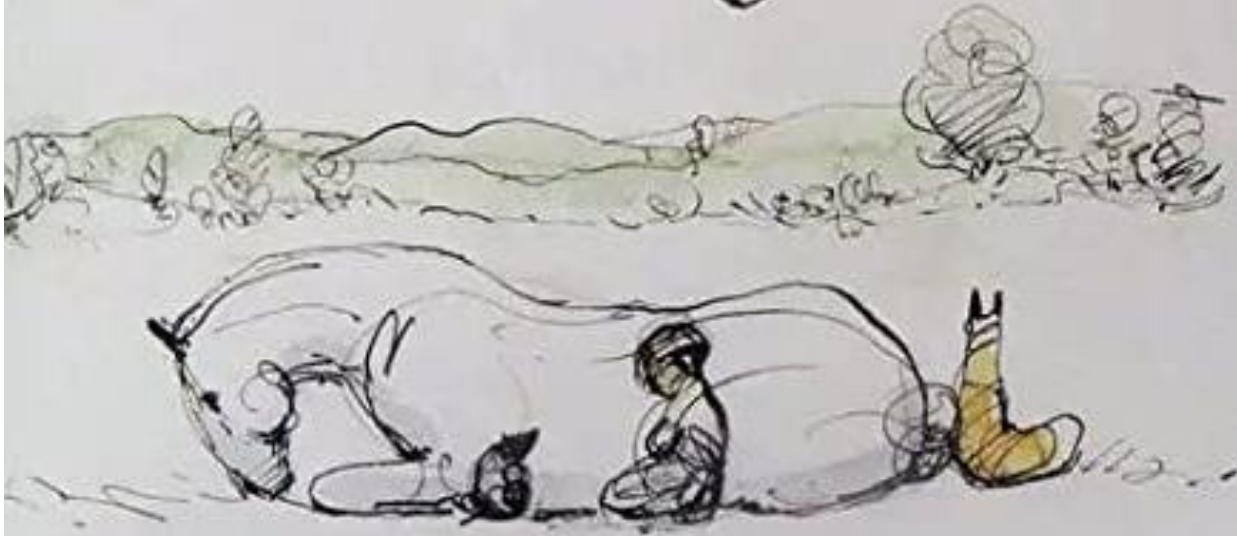

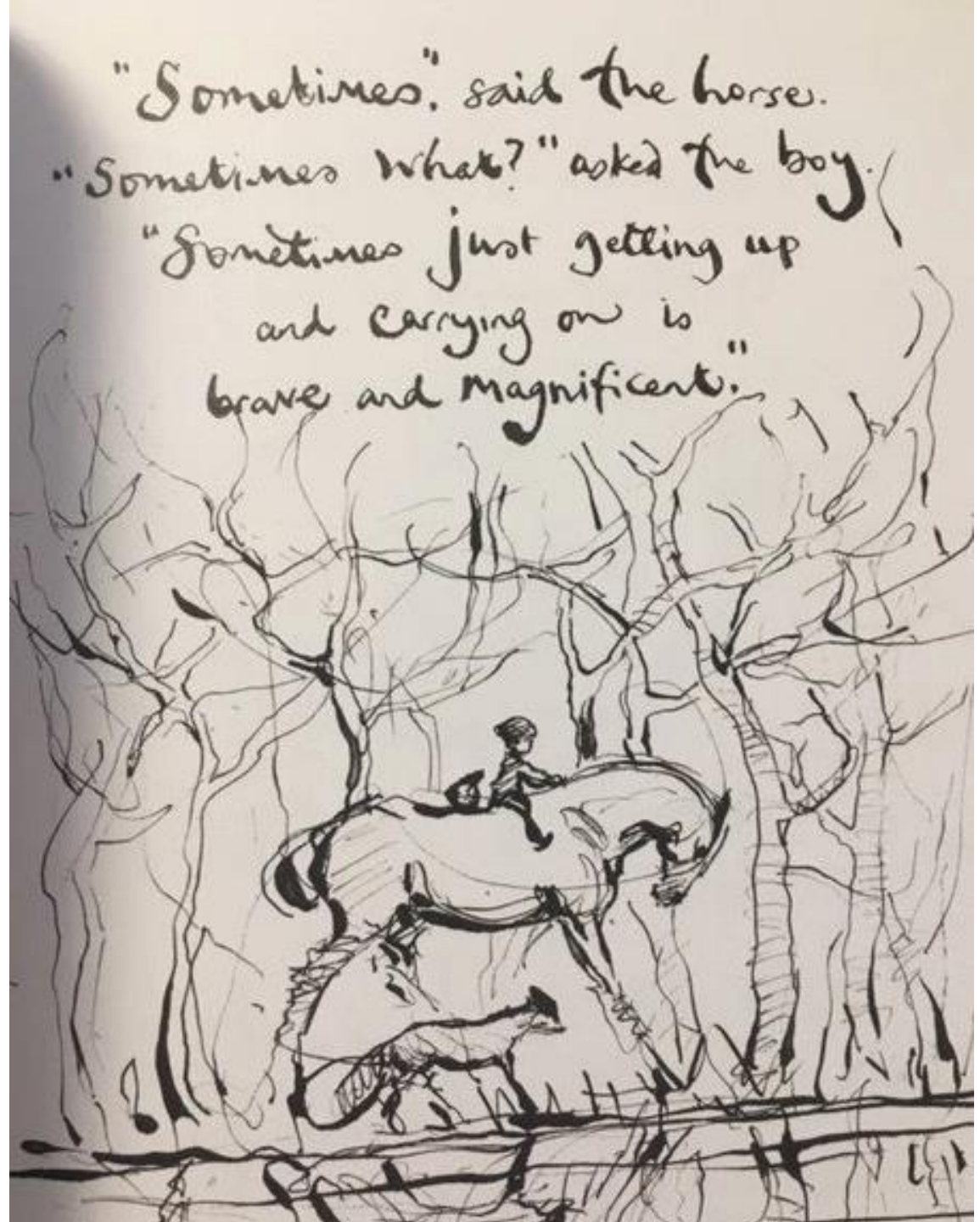
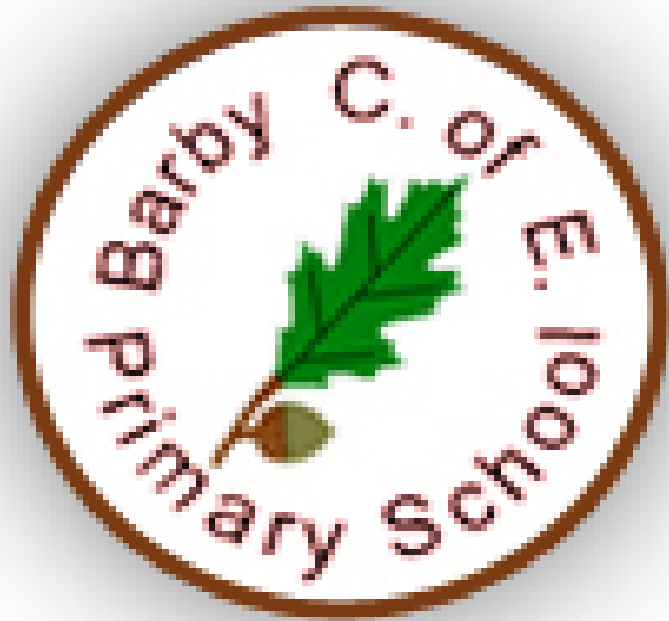


*Like the storm in the story, this has been a challenging term for many of us, but we have made it through.*

*I wonder which one resonates most with you, which one has had the greatest impact or which one you cherish the most?*

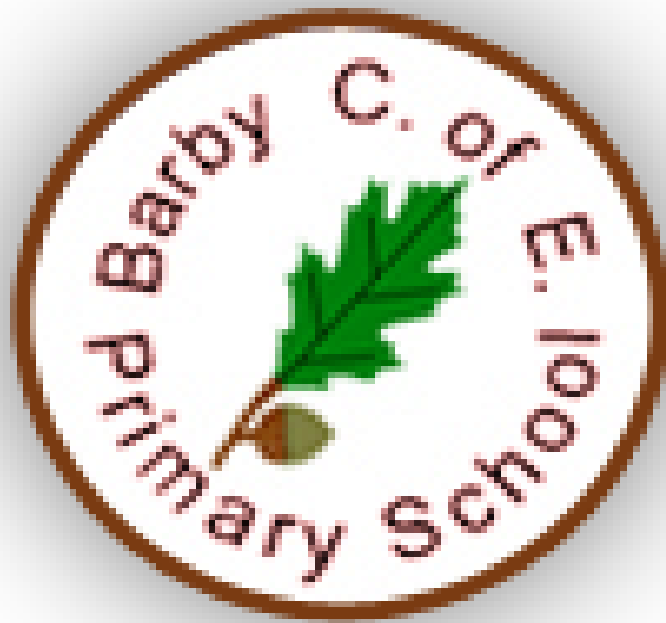
