## Half Term Hot Food Community Kitchen



We are honoured to be hosting a 'Hot Food Community Kitchen' here at St George's Monday-Friday during the Half Term Holiday.

With valentine's day approaching and a theme of love in the air we felt it important to show how our Christian ethos exudes love and giving at this time; and how even more important it is to show love with the additional challenges we presently face.

Mrs. Atkar has organised this through an organisation known as the Midlands Langar Seva Society (MLSS). The charity was established in October 2013 in Walsall providing hot food and drink to those living on the street, schools, safe houses and those on the poverty line. MLSS operates on Sikh based ethos, where they strive to help and support all people regardless of social status- these values parallel with our own Christian values.
