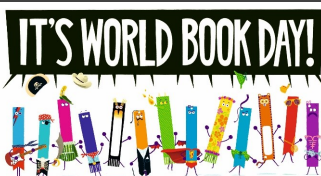
Welcome Back!

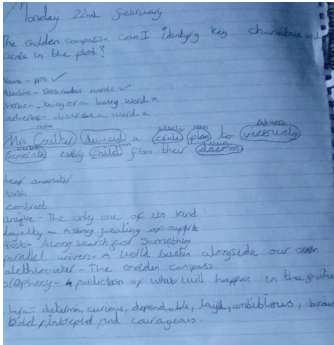
Maks (Year 3) and Alexander (Nursery) have made a wonderful Spring scene for the staff over the half term holidays.

It is in the main entrance for all staff to see as they enter the building.

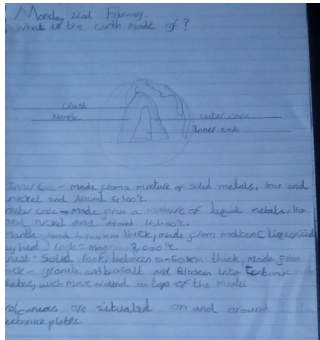

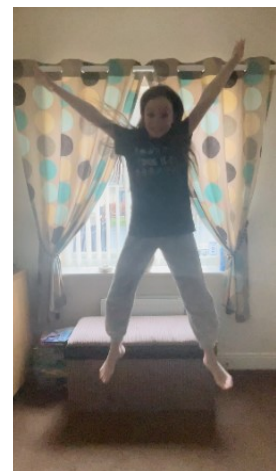

Health Reminder
