PHSE Lessons - Years 1 - 6

In our PHSE lessons this term, we will be discussing the NSPCC's Underwear Rule. This is designed to teach pupils how to stay safe, without giving explicit information or telling scary stories or even using specific terminology. In the lesson, children will learn about the 'PANTS' acrostic, which stands for:

- Privates are private
- Always remember your body belongs to you
- No means no
- Talk about secrets that upset you
- Speak up, someone can help
