- 3:30pm Year 4/5/6

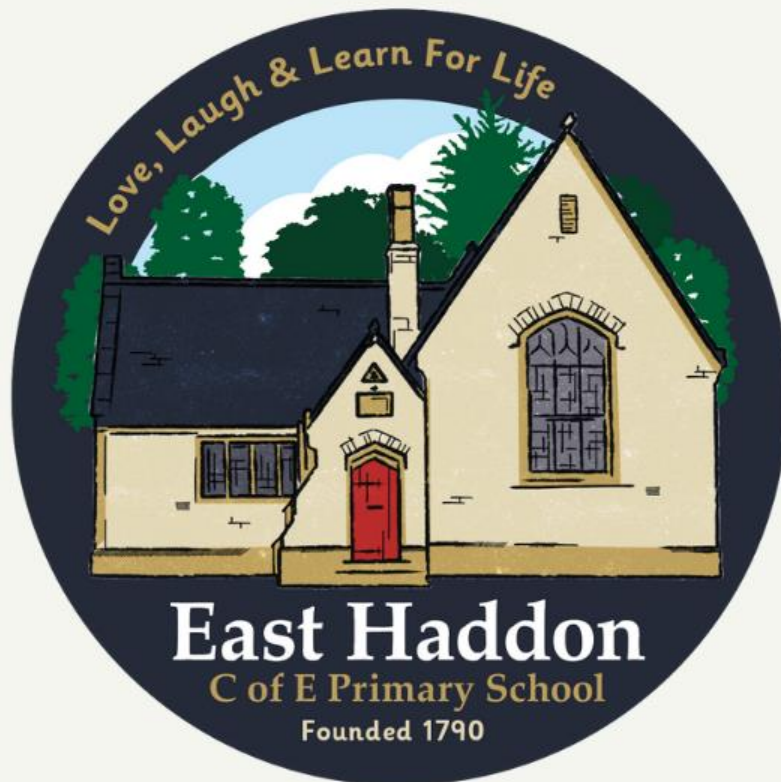
We would appreciate it if you could pick up and move on promptly to avoid too much congestion around the school. Thank you for your continued co-operation.

Advance notice: After half term and our visit to The Pioneer Centre we will begin our 'Where in the World?' presentations –

Each child needs to prepare a presentation on a world event or achievement; some examples from previous years are: The 2004 Tsunami, The Great plague of London, The Journey of the Pilgrim Fathers, The 1966 World Cup, The Flying Scotsman, Plastic Pollution, The Yucatan Meteorite, The Holocaust, Super Volcanoes and the Everest Avalanche.

They should be prepared to talk to the class for about 4/5 minutes and can include pictures, diagrams or illustrations; they may do it as a PowerPoint presentation if they wish but they do not have to; a confident presentation with good knowledge and eye contact is what we are looking for.

They need to describe the event clearly, where it occurred and any impact it has had.

If they have used a PowerPoint presentation, they can bring their presentation in on a memory stick or email it into school.

We will begin with the children in Year 6 and will go in alphabetical order down the register and hope to see about 10 presentations each week; Years 4 and 5 will therefore have more time to prepare.

Trek to Tokyo

Well done and thank you to everyone who has logged their home activities on the Northamptonshire website so far to support our challenge.
