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Précis of Teaching and Learning Governor Meeting held on 11th May 2021

The Teaching and Learning Committee met (virtually) on 11th February. Minutes of the meeting will be published on the school website in due course. All members of the committee were in attendance. Key topics that were addressed were as follows:-

Covid-19:

We reflected on the Remote Learning Plan and agreed that the school found the balance in providing what a broad and balanced curriculum. The content and delivery were very well received, which is a testament to the hard work of the teachers. The challenges since returning include social and emotional issues such as turn taking, patience, sharing etc. The Catch-Up Premium plan has been reviewed and is on the school website. Governors ask questioned about how, where and why the premium was being spent and were pleased with the clear, fair decision making process.

Attendance:

The governors were delighted to hear that 100% of children are back in school following the most recent lockdown and that school attendance is currently at about 96%, which is higher than national average.

Safeguarding:

Safeguarding remains an absolute priority of the school. Evidence of this was found during this term's governor link visit as well as through policies, ongoing training, risk assessments and Head teacher newsletters. Two pupil voice surveys have been carried out this term, with extremely positive results about how safe pupils at AECPS feel, both in school and online.

Governance Newsletter/Director's Report:

Each term Cheshire East release a Governance Newsletter. Each committee draws out relevant parts and it was noted that the school had already addressed matters that had been mentioned in it, such as staff and pupil well-being, the change in the Early Career Framework etc. This demonstrates the school being forward thinking in it's approach.

Governor Training:

Governors shared materials and opinions on their recent training, the uptake of which shows a commitment by the governors to continue supporting and challenging the school. A folder has been created on the Governor Virtual Office to share knowledge and promote discussions, particularly in line with reviewing key policies.
