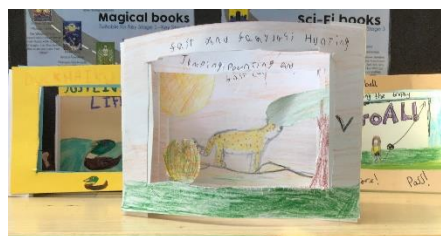
Scarecrows
