Dear Parents and Carers,

We are at the end of the second week and the children have enjoyed staying for lunch! They are getting used to the rules, routines and playing on the big playground.

As from next week (20/09/21), we will be opening the doors in the morning between **8.45am and 8.55am**. **Children arriving after this time will be marked as 'late' and have to sign in at the school office.** Your children will be staying all day and will be collected at **3.25pm**.

If you are sending them in with a packed lunch, please make sure that it is a balanced meal e.g. a sandwich/sausage roll/pasta (something savoury). They can also have some fruit, crisps or a biscuit (please no sweets). They have 25 minutes to eat so please do not over-pack their lunch boxes. **We are a nut free school** as we have children with severe nut allergies, so please no peanut butter or Nutella in sandwiches.

Please bring in a **named** Forest School kit (waterproof trousers and jacket and wellies) on Monday in a **named** carrier bag. This will stay in school and will be sent home at half term if needed.

Also, **Friday 24th September is our first PE day**. Please ensure your child **comes into school wearing their PE kit** with the **correct colour t-shirt** for their house. They also need **plain black or white trainers and green or black jogging bottoms**. Please can we ask that **NO earrings** are worn on Fridays.
