Our learning this week

Another positive week from Y6, who are continuing to work hard and apply themselves in all aspects of learning.

In maths, Y6 have continued with their focus on place value and number. They have ordered sets of values presented in a variety of ways, reasoned in depth and solved a range of problems.

In writing, we have focused on the connect stage, focusing on developing our understanding of the following skills: using relative clauses, applying modal verbs to communicate with the reader, and developing formal vocabulary within a paragraph.

In reading, Y6 have continued to explore the core text on more detail, thinking about making comparisons to different books. They have also looked at a range of non-fiction texts, developing a greater understanding of Europe and its ecosystems.

In learning mission, we have developed our own presentation about climate change in the UK, looked at how we can re-wild urban areas and developed our own 'Stop Climate Change' Propaganda.

Throughout the rest of the week, we have had a range of sessions, including:

- Recognising the differing types of bark and how this can help identify trees, at Forest Schools
- Developing a healthy balanced meal in PSHE
- Recognising groupings of differing types of animals, in Science.
- A continuous training session and a focus on dribbling in basketball.
