Sacramental Preparation 2021/2022

Father Neil has asked me to let you know the following information:

CONFIRMATION: For children in Year 6 and above. Those wishing to join the Confirmation Preparation Sessions must attend the meeting to be held this Saturday, 18th September at 4:45pm in Christ the King Parish Hall and join us for Mass afterwards. There will be 7 sessions and the Bishop will administer the sacrament in November 2021.

FIRST CONFESSION: For children in Year 3 and above. Classes begin in February 2022.

FIRST HOLY COMMUNION For children in Year 4 and above. Classes begin in the Spring Term (children must have already made their First Confession in order to join this class)

Mass attendance is important for families who children wish to receive the above Sacraments. If you are not currently attending Mass, you are invited to do so.

Secondary applications for September 2022

It is now time to make your preferences for High School if your child is in Year 6. Usually, each school website will host key dates for you to gain further information about the setting. In addition, it is recommended that you visit the respective schools to help you with your decision about High School settings. Application forms need to be submitted by **31st October 2021** online to Leeds City Council. Supplementary Information Forms (SIFs) should be submitted to High School.
