As I am sure you are aware the UK is hosting the world leaders at the UN COP26 climate conference and the eyes of the world will be on us to lead the way in combatting the climate emergency!

What is COP26?

The UN holds a climate conference (COP) each year in different countries around the world, where world leaders gather to talk about climate change.

As a reminder, only if someone displays the classic Covid-19 symptoms (persistent cough, fever, loss of taste/smell), they should self-isolate and book a PCR test.
