

The Pupil Premium 2012 – 2013

Kirkstall Valley Primary School has received £42,000 as part of its School Budget share from free school meals and looked after pupils.

Kirkstall Valley Primary School is committed to its aim of ensuring all children reach their full potential in these important primary school years.

The money has been allocated for targeted intervention as follows:

Teaching support for intervention teaching	£ 22,880
Small group tuition for targeted children	£ 12,097
Support for children / families through pastoral TA	£ 12,551

FSM children were negatively affected by the arrival of a SA+ child working at Level 1s at the end of March, 2012 from another primary.

In 2 levels progress, there is no significant difference between FSM and Non-FSM children.
