



Boxgrove Primary School – September 2013 – 2014

Use of Pupil Premium 2013-2014

Background

The Pupil Premium is allocated to children from low-income families who are currently eligible for Free School Meals (FSM) in both mainstream and non-mainstream settings and children who have been looked after by the local authority continuously for more than six months. In 2012-2013 this funding was extended to also include pupils eligible for FSM at any point in the last six years (known as the ever 6 FSM measure).

Schools are free to spend the Pupil Premium as they see fit. However we will be held accountable for how we have used the additional funding to support pupils from low income families. From September 2012, we have been required to publish online information about how we are using the Premium. This will ensure that parents and others are made fully aware of the Premium and the extra support that pupils receive.

Boxgrove Primary School funding

In 2013-2014 Boxgrove Primary School received £37.800 for Pupil Premium.

40 pupils are benefitting from this funding in 2013-2014.



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Activities selected	What this does	Targeted pupils	Cost
1. One to one tuition	This is where an individual pupil is removed from their class and given intensive tuition. The tuition is targeted at improving their Literacy or Maths skills. The child is given one hours extra tuition each week for one term.	Year 5 and 6 pupils	£2765
2. Support from the Home School Link Worker	The Home School Link Worker works with families to provide support and advice. She also works 1:1 with some children to support them socially and emotionally.	All year groups	£6930
3. Writing project	The school has developed a writing project that supports writing development and pupils' motivation for writing. The teaching support staff delivering this programme receives training before running the intervention.	Year 2, 5 and 6 pupils	£1249
4. Reading intervention sessions	The school follows a structured reading intervention programme. All teaching support staff that use this programme have training before running the intervention. The children that have benefitted from this programme have taken part in 2x 15 minutes sessions each week for between 10-14 weeks on average.	Year 1, 2 and 6 pupils	£1633
5. Maths intervention sessions	Maths intervention to be planned for 10-14 weeks for children to accelerate their progress and understanding in maths. The teaching support staff delivering this programme receives training before running the intervention.	Year 2, 4, 5 and 6 pupils	£2849
6. Foundation Stage Early Intervention Support Assistant	An early intervention support assistant will work alongside identified children in class and through intervention to ensure that they make accelerated progress in specified areas of learning.	Reception	£7000
7. Key Stage One Support Assistant	Allows children to work alongside an adult to achieve targets set, in class and through intervention.	Key Stage 1	£6500
8. Training for support assistants supporting pupils	Provides professional development for support staff to ensure that we are providing high quality interventions and support for pupils.	Key stage 2	£1512
9. Family partnership sessions	Families are invited into school 1x termly to work alongside their child to take part in a family learning session. Trained teachers deliver the	All year groups	£1245



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	sessions to focus on how parents can support their child at home in reading, writing and maths.		
10. Pupil premium meetings with parents	Each term parents meet with class teachers to plan the support for their child during the term. They plan what the child needs to remove barriers to their learning and make enhanced progress at school. Targets are set for the term and the people responsible for fulfilling the targets are identified.	All year groups	£3307
11. Training for feedback	Class teachers are provided with training to ensure that they are providing high quality feedback to pupils.	All year groups	£548
12. Support with additional school activities and resourcing.	Children are provided with appropriate resources to remove barriers to their learning and access the resources required to achieve success at school.	All year groups	£2262
