The Pupil Premium 2013-2014

What is Pupil Premium?

The Pupil Premium is funding allocated to schools for specific purpose of boosting the attainment of pupils from low-income families. Funding is based on children who have registered for a free school meal at any point the last 6 years, children that have been in care for more than six months, children subject to a Residency Order and children whose parents are currently serving in the armed forces.

Why has Pupil Premium been introduced?

The Government believes that the Pupil Premium, which is additional to main school finding, is the best way to address the current underlying inequalities between children eligible fro Free School Meals (FSM) and their wealthier peers by ensuring that funding to tackle disadvantage reaches the pupils who need it most. Whilst schools are free tp spend the Pupil Premium as they see fit we are required to publish online information about how we have used the Premium.

Funding Breakdown

For the financial year:

- 2011-12- £26,178.67 (@ £488)
- 2012-13- £49,965.00 (@ £623)
- 2013-14- £71,722.00 (@ £953)
- 2014-15- £ 96,200 (based on set budget @ £1300)

2013-14 - The percentage of our pupils known to be eligible for Pupil Premium is 34%. The national percentage is 26.7% (based on 2012)

How we used Pupil Premium 2013-2014

During 2013- 2014 we used Pupil Premium in the following ways:

- Further enhancing our learning environment -Experiential learning environment for each theme for each phase.
- Raising Aspirations -Skills Show- NEC, Grade 6 Brass Accreditation, Me, Myself, My Future (Yr 4)
- Specialist Resources, including ICT - 'I am Learning'
- Curriculum Enrichment, including special Events- 'memorable experiences' for children and parents.
- Inclusion Wrap-a-round for children (PAWs), including meal subsidies
- 1:1 Tuition, HLTA and Mentoring Support & targeted interventions
- Boosters -Yr 6 Marvellous Mentors
- Educational Visits
- Forest School Training
- Pupil Leadership development
