Pupil Premium 2014-2015

The Pupil Premium is an allocation of funding, in addition to main school funding, which schools receive according to the number of children in specific groups.

School receive Pupil Premium funding for:

- All children who are eligible for free school meals
- All children who have been eligible for free school meals in the last 6 years
- All children who have been looked after continuously for more than 6 months by someone other than their immediate family

School is required to publish how they spend this funding to narrow the gap and how effective this spending is. Many of the Pupil Premium children start school below national expectations and as such the school targets high proportion of Pupil Premium into foundation stage and key stage 1. In this way the gap is narrowed at the start of the child's education.

Should children still be below national expectations in key stage 2 our pupil premium funding is used to provide high quality interventions aimed at narrowing the gap further.

These interventions are monitored and evaluated by the schools leadership team to ensure success. The following list is how the school is using its Pupil Premium money to narrow the gaps in progress and achievement.

<p>Numicon This is targeted at children working below age related expectations – delivered by a Numicon trained teacher, used in small groups.</p>	Year 3 – Year 4	Small group tuition +4 months
<p>Every Child Counts This is targeted at the lowest achieving Year 2 children in Maths. They receive small group tuition and 1 to 1 if needed for a full term. This is delivered by a Number Counts trained teacher & STA.</p>	Year 2	Small group tuition +4 months One to one tuition +5 months
<p>Toe by Toe Reading Programme This programme is designed for children who struggle to read in years 3 -6, and who's difficulties can be attributed to poor phonics understanding or knowledge. Children receive 20 minutes 1:1 daily support from a trained Teaching Assistant. This is a long term programme and sees children making significant progress in their reading age.</p>	Year 3 – Year 6	One to one tuition +5 months
<p>More Able Maths Groups A highly qualified teacher works with groups of children to target them to achieve level 4 before the end of Year 4 and level 5 or 6 by the end of Year 6.</p>	Year 3 – Year 6	Small group tuition +4 months

<p>More Able Comprehension Groups A highly qualified teacher works with groups of children to target them to achieve level 4 before the end of Year 4 and level 5 or 6 by the end of Year 6.</p>	Year 3 – Year 6	Small group tuition +4 months
<p>Attendance Increase in hours for administrative assistant to pursue persistent absence and lateness.</p>	School wide	
<p>SEN and Pupil Premium Extended hours for children receiving Pupil Premium and are statemented. Funding is used to increase their level of Teaching Assistant's support.</p>	Various	Teaching Assistants +1 month
<p>Talking Families This is a targeted programme to encourage parents and children to communicate more effectively. It is a tailored 6 week course delivered by a trained Teaching Assistant.</p>	Foundation Stages	Parental Involvement +3 months
<p>Talk for Writing Training for whole school in fiction and non-fiction. It is an acclaimed programme that is aimed at improving writing skills.</p>	Whole school	
<p>Webster Stratton Parenting Group/ Dinosaur School This programme is run twice a year for 6 weeks. The Dinosaur School is highly successful in engaging children and parents. It strengthens social, emotional and academic skills.</p>	FS - KS1	Parental Involvement +3 months
<p>'Back to School' A programme running for 6 weeks led by the Year 6 teacher and Deputy Head encouraging parents and children to work together on 'basic skills'.</p>	Year 6	Parental Involvement +3 months
<p>Breakfast Club Reading Senior Teaching Assistant employed to target individual reading with children attending breakfast club</p>	Across all year groups	One to one tuition +5 months

As well as supporting these very successful programmes Pupil Premium funding has also been used:

- To employ two Learning Support Assistants to support children with emotional difficulties to access the curriculum and accelerate their progress
- To allow teaching assistants and teachers to access training for intervention programmes

- Purchasing Resources to encourage reading and to support the intervention programmes
