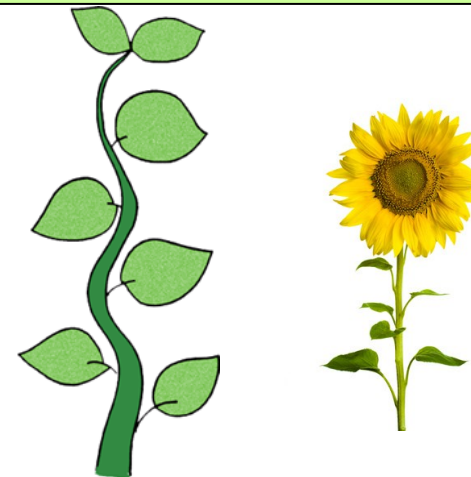

Providing Better Outcomes for Children

CORE AREAS OF LEARNING

<p>Literacy</p> 	<p>This term we will be reading a range of traditional tales. We will focus on story language used in these style of texts and also begin to write our own traditional tales. In phonics we will continue to look at new ways of making sounds already taught. We will be working hard to form our lower case letters correctly.</p>
<p>Maths</p> 	<p>This term we will continue to develop the children's mathematical skills and build on what they have been taught during the first term. As well as developing the children's knowledge of number and shape we will also measure using different apparatus.</p> <p>We will further develop our counting skills to and beyond 100. The children will need to secure their reading and writing of numbers to at least 20 so that we can work towards 100.</p>
<p>Science</p>	<p>As part of our topic 'growing'. We will be making observations of trees, plants and all things that grow. We will grow our own plants and observe the changes that take place over time. We will carry out simple tests exploring how plants can be affected by lack of light and water.</p>
<p>Computing</p> 	<p>This term we will be using ICT as part of our literacy, numeracy and topic work. We will look at the importance of e-safety and explore why this is important.</p>

ENRICHMENT AREAS OF LEARNING

<p>Topic</p> 	<p>As part of our history topic we will be re-researching famous artists such as Van Gogh and Georgia O'Keefe. We will explore time-lines and place events in chronological order. We will look at the impact these artists made to the world of art and research their lives. In Spring 2 our topic focus will be 'What the ladybird heard'. As part of this topic we intend to visit a local farm.</p>
<p>RE</p>	<p>This half term we will be focussing our learning around 'special books.' We will also be sharing our own experiences of cultures and ways of life. Children will look at a range of cultures and nationalities to further develop knowledge of the world around them.</p>
<p>Art & Design</p>	<p>In Spring 1 we will be developing our painting skills. We will explore using a range of paints and acquiring new skills with paint. The children will study and explore paintings of plants by famous artists such as Van Gogh.</p>
<p>PE</p>	<p>This term we will be developing our dance skills in PE. It is important that your child has a PE kit as they will need to get changed every session. It would be useful if all PE kits could remain in school for the duration of the half term. Please ensure all items are clearly labelled.</p>
