Pupil Premium 2014-2015

In 2012, the Government launched its Pupil Premium Grant (PPG), additional funding allocated to schools in order to improve the outcomes for disadvantaged children. The money is allocated to schools based on the number of pupils who currently meet the criteria to be eligible for Free School Meals (FSM) or those that have been at some point in the previous six years.
