Focus of Pupil Premium Grant 2014/2015	
Purpose	Impact
Focussed teaching and/or support	PP pupils achieved good or better progress and attainment as other pupils across a variety of subjects and in all age ranges.
Pastoral support services for families	Pupils with emotional difficulties were able to access internal and external support to remove barriers to their learning.
Resources to support delivery of the curriculum	Class based and school-wide resources helped the delivery of lessons across the curriculum and to aid booster groups.

Measuring the Impact of the Pupil Premium

Senior and Middle Leaders:

- Senior and Middle Leaders monitor the impact of Pupil Premium spending through a variety of means:
Half termly Pupil Progress meetings where progress and attainment are rigorously analysed.
- Monitoring of children's work and planning to ensuring PP pupils are being catered for effectively.
- Evaluation of interventions and the impact that they are having

Class Teachers:

Class Teachers are responsible for ensuring PP pupils are identified so that they are catered for and any gaps that arise are closed effectively.

Governors:

A designated Pupil Premium governor assists in the overseeing of how Pupil Premium funding is spent, monitors how the funding is used to raise standards and makes sure the school has a clear policy on Pupil Premium.
