

Radleys Uniform



Our policy is based on the fact that a school uniform:

- promotes a sense of pride in the school;
- makes children feel part of a community;
- is practical, safe and smart;
- identifies the children as representatives of the school;
- is not distracting in class (as fashion clothes might be);
- makes children feel equal to their peers in terms of appearance;
- has been designed with health and safety in mind.

Every day wear:

Shirt	Year 1-6 White, with a collar (no polo shirts) Early Years – polo shirts, no tie
Tie (Y1-6 only) Y1 - 4 – elasticated Y5 – 6 – tying	Plain red - available from the school office
Jumper, cardigan available from School Trends	Red with the school logo
Coats – Fleece or Waterproof jacket	School logo coats are available from School Trends
Trousers or skirts	Grey
Hats – available from the school office	Winter – red knitted hat with the school logo Summer – red baseball hat with the school logo
Hair accessories	A red Alice band or red bobbles and red slides. No flowers or other ornaments are to be worn.
Summer uniform – optional (from Easter to July)	Red and white check/ gingham dresses for girls (no tie) Grey shorts for boys/girls (to be worn with a shirt and tie) Black school shoes only – no sandals.
Earrings	Small gold or silver studs only.
Socks and tights	Socks – grey with trousers and shorts and white with skirts Tights – red
Footwear	Flat black shoes. No heels. No trainers.
Book bags – available from the school office	For all children from Nursery to Y6
Nail varnish and make-up are not allowed in school	

For P.E.

Shorts only, no skorts	Black
T- shirt	Red, with the school logo
Track suits (for outdoor PE)	Navy Blue or black
Pumps	Black
Trainers (for outdoor PE)	Black

For swimming (Y3, Y4 and Y5 only):

Swimming costume (girls)	This should be a full costume not bikini or tankini tops.
Trunks (boys)	These should not be shorts or swimming shorts.
Swimming cap (available from the school office)	Red
Towel	Named
Goggles	Optional, but not advisable

Jewellery, Haircuts, Tattoos

School is a place of education and study. We want our children to be proud to belong to our school community and to feel part of our school team. School uniform covers much more than clothes and the key to ensuring that all children feel a part is uniformity with no extremes of styles, fashions etc. that might distract pupils from their studies.

On health and safety grounds, we do not allow children to wear any jewellery in school. The exceptions to this rule are studs in pierced ears and a watch. We ask children to remove these objects during PE. No jewellery can be worn for swimming. For this reason we ask that children do not have their ears pierced during term time, as it is then several weeks before the earrings can be removed.

The school does not permit children to have haircuts that could serve as a distraction to other children, such as extremes of styles, hair colouring in bright colours, shaved heads, asymmetrical designs or names/designs/patterns shaved into hair. Fringes need to be smart to enable children to see during lessons. Hairspray, gel, wax or other hair products are not allowed in school. Long hair needs to be tied back for all P.E. lessons and swimming activities. Parents will be contacted and expected to ensure their child haircut is in line with school policy.

Tattoos, whether permanent or temporary, are not acceptable.
